Following a member's meeting in 2021 it was agreed to create a new PBA ranking system, in preparation for the 2022/23 season.

The points are now awarded as follows, providing that there are more than 32 players in the events. For events with less than 32 players the points in brackets will be awarded.

| Winner | - | 100 points | (50 points) |

Points will only be accumulated from the highest scoring event in the same competition for players who attend more than one event per competition. These points will remain on the list for 2 years.

The ranking list will be compiled as follows: -

1. The player with the highest number of Total Points from all the different WBT qualifying events over the past two years.
2. If the Total Points are equal the player with the highest number of points obtained in World Open Singles qualifiers will be ranked higher.
3. If the Total Points and World Qualifying Points are equal the player with highest number of points from the Scottish International Open qualifiers will be ranked higher.
4. If the Total Points, World Qualifying Points and Scottish International Points are equal the player with the highest number of points from the International Open qualifiers will be ranked higher.
5. If the Total points, World Qualifying Points, Scottish International Points and International Open Points are equal the player with the highest number of points from the later season will be ranked higher.
6. If the players remain level after the 5 scenarios above a play off match will be arranged between the two players, in the event of the time available making it impossible to arrange such a play off match the players will be decided by ballot.
