#### PBA FINALS WEEKEND RETURNS TO INVERCARGILL

Invercargill's Waverley Bowling Club will host the New Zealand Professional Bowls Association Finals Weekend this weekend for the first time since 2013. Play begins on Friday night at 5pm with a 'Shanghai' singles qualifier for players to get used to the rink with the playoffs in earnest under way from 8.30am on Saturday.

The fields look wide open this year with only a few PBA internationals making it this far. Hawkes Bay's Mike Isaacson is the most experienced in the Scottish Singles field having played in the 2020 World Indoor Pairs. But also look out for Auckland's David Motu as an up-and-coming star of the future.

Dunedin's Andy McLean, partnering with Brent McEwan in the World Indoor Pairs, has played twice in the UK and once against Australia, while the Wellington pair feature PBA Chairman Richard Corry who has also played twice in the UK (once for NZ and once for Canada) and Ian McLeod. And the Taranaki pair of Craig DeFaria and John Roberts are a very experienced combination.

The UK Singles has perhaps the toughest field with a feature clash at 4pm on Saturday between NZ No.2 Craig Tinker and No.7 Aidan Zittersteijn, though Isaacson and Corry are also in the mix.

Wairarapa's Garry Muriwai comes in as a late replacement in the World Indoor Singles and will be one to watch having played in the UK in 2003. Taranaki's Dean Elgar is making an impact as a PBA rookie this year, and Southland's Kerry Heffer could make the NZ Ladies Invitation Singles nomination if she were to win the World Indoor Singles event.
